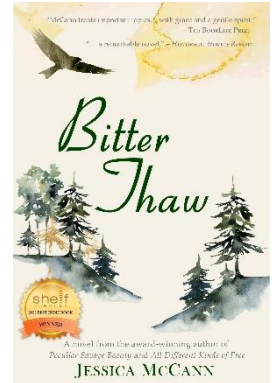


Research and Sources
